PRIMARY STEEL INDUSTRY OVERVIEW

Overview of the primary steel industry in South Africa

South Africa was ranked the 19'th largest crude steel producing country in the world by the International Iron and Steel Institute (IISI) in 2005 and as net exporting country (exports-imports) of primary steel, South Africa was ranked 9th in the world during 2004. South Africa is also the largest steel producer in Africa, producing 53% of the total crude steel production of the continent during 2005.

Total South African crude steel production amounted to 9,493 million tonnes in 2005, a decrease of 0.1%, compared with 9,500 million tonnes during 2004. This represents 0,8% of world production which reached 1 129,4 million tonnes in 2005 according to the International Iron and Steel Institute (IISI), an increase of 5,9% when compared with 2004.

Carbon steel deliveries by the primary steel industry amounted to 7,628 million tonnes in 2005, a decrease of 1,3% compared with 2004. During 2005 4,230 million tonnes of carbon steel products were sold on the local market, a decrease of 6,1% compared with 2004. During 2005 3,398 million tonnes of carbon steel products were exported, an increase of 5,5% compared with 2004.

Imports of carbon and alloy primary steel products during 2005 amounted to 0,336 million tonnes, an increase of 8,9% compared with 2004. Imports of carbon and alloy steel during 2005 accounted for 7,4% of apparent domestic carbon steel consumption compared to 6,4% of apparent domestic carbon steel consumption during 2004.

The range of primary carbon steel products and semi-finished products manufactured in South Africa includes billets, blooms, slabs, forgings, light, medium- and heavy sections and bars, reinforcing bar, railway track material, wire rod, seamless tubes, plates, hot- and cold-rolled coils and sheets, electrolytic galvanised coils and sheets, tinplate and pre-painted coils and sheets.

The range of primary stainless steel products and semi-finished products manufactured in South Africa includes slabs, plates and hot- and cold-rolled coils and sheets.

Apart from the estimated 2 million tonnes of ferrous-scrap sourced from the market, of which 0,087 million tonnes were imported by the local primary steel industry in 2005, a volume of 0,386 million tonnes of ferrous scrap were exported by metal recyclers.

During 2005 an estimated total of 40 million tonnes of iron ore were mined in South Africa, contributing about 3 % to world production from about 1% of the world reserve base. Approximately 15 million tonnes were consumed locally. During this period about 25 million tonnes of iron ore were exported from South Africa accounting for approximately 4% of global trade.
